Terms:

- 10 hours per week (minimum)
- Payscale Oxford Living Wage (could be higher depending on experience)

Necessary Skills

- Set up and install equipment such as cameras, microphones, sound speakers, video screens, projectors, video monitors, recording equipment.
- Set up and maintain video equipment.
- Set up and maintain sound equipment
- Set up and maintain lighting equipment
- Understanding of Mac and PC operating systems
- Knowledge of creative software (Adobe Creative suite, etc)

Training will be provided on Film Oxford equipment where required

Duties to include:

- Maintain FO equipment in optimum working service
- Maintain a clean and tidy equipment store
- Maintain / order consumerables
- Repair equipment where possible
- Send in equipment for repairs as needed.
- Maintain inventory of equipment.
- Set up equipment prior to workshops and events
- Maintain and update computers and workstations
- Back up and ensure the safe storage and integrity of data.
- Other tasks that the Film Oxford Executive may request appropriate to your skills.
